Price Anchors for 20 ft

Wholesale farm pricing can be on the low end; rare species or near-perfect form push to the high end.

What Drives Price

Species and cultivar - Eastern White Pine usually lower, Japanese Black Pine higher. Crown symmetry and density, trunk taper, and root ball integrity increase price.

Where to Buy and Markups

Grower nurseries or farms - most transparent pricing and clear warranties.

Delivery and Equipment

A 20 ft tree usually needs a flatbed or rollback truck, plus straps and wind protection.

Seasonality and Deals

Dormant season planting (early spring or fall) improves establishment and often yields better pricing.

Ask about off-peak discounts, cosmetic grade options, and bundle pricing for privacy rows.

Pre-book popular sizes early in high-demand regions to avoid price spikes.

Spec Check Before Paying

Needles - deep green, no widespread yellowing; branches springy, not brittle.

Root ball - firm and moist, with no loose, dried roots.

Request current photos or video of your exact specimen before shipment.

Paperwork and Warranty

Itemized invoice: tree, delivery, equipment, installation, materials, warranty terms.

Written first-year care notes and a contact with response time for claims.

Replacement policy clarity if a tree fails within the warranty window.

Ways to Save

Mix sizes - a few large anchors plus smaller fillers for effect at a lower total cost.

Choose hardy, locally common species for your zone to reduce loss risk.

DIY light tasks if allowed by installer - mulch ring or deer guards.
