

## Pine vs. Cedar Cabin: The Ultimate Decision Checklist

Section 1: Budget & Cost
My primary focus is:

Cost Considerations:

$\hfill \Box$ <b>Cedar:</b> Reddish-brown tones, aromatic scent, consistent and sophisticated appearance.
